USPS WEATHER COURSE SPRING/FALL 2018

I am happy to announce that I will be teaching the United States Power Squadron (USPS) WEATHER Course this Spring and Fall 2018. This is a 10 week course that covers the basics of Meteorology, Storms, and relates them to boating. We all experience weather on a daily basis and sometimes see the extremes of weather. Safe boating requires that we be aware of weather, particularly adverse weather and how to recognize it, preferably in advance. I plan to teach this course in two sections. The first of five weeks in Spring 2018, will be devoted to the basics of Meteorology, understanding basic weather phenomena, what causes weather. The second section will be in Fall 2018 and will be devoted to understanding what causes storms in both the Mid-continental regions of the world, and also in tropical latitudes. A chapter will be devoted to weather forecasting. In addition, a trip will be planned to visit the Green Bay National Weather Service station to watch the launch of a weather balloon. These launches are done across the globe at 1200 and 2400 GMT and provide the source of much of the data that comprises our global weather maps.

This will be my first experience with teaching Weather. I took USPS Weather in the past, taught a 2 hour USPS Weather Seminar and learned a lot about weather from my training as a Commercial and Instrument Rated Private Pilot. Over 40 plus years of boating I have experienced my share of on the water weather.

DATES, TIMES, LOCATIONS

The Spring Session will be held on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-7:30 pm beginning March 7 through April 4 at the Brown County Central Library, 515 Pine St. in Green Bay, WI. I will also be using GO TO MEETING SOFTWARE to be able to offer USPS WEATHER to those students who are not able to travel to Green Bay for the Classroom Sessions.

Weather Course Description

The safety and comfort of those who venture out-on-the water have always been weather dependent. In this course students will become keener observers of the weather, but weather observations only have meaning in the context of the basic principles of meteorology — the science of the atmosphere.

The course focuses on how weather systems form, behave, move, and interact with one another and reflects the availability of all sorts of weather reports and forecasts on the Internet. Wx2012 is a general weather course benefiting those sitting in their living rooms, as much as those standing behind the helm. Each student receives:

- a Weather Manual *USPS Weather* an explanatory text with full color photographs and drawings covering weather in the United States and its coastal and inland waters;
- a set of three Daily Weather Maps learning aids with a compete explanation of map symbols designed to develop weather map reading and analysis skills; and

NOAA's Sky Watcher Chart - a reference to assist in identifying cloud types – helpful indicators of approaching weather.

The Weather Course is designed to be conducted over ten two-hour sessions including time for review and the multiple choice closed book exam, but each instructor will determine the pace of the course. Member cost is \$65 and non-member cost is \$85.

We can readily do the short 2-hour "Jump Start" orientation and immediately qualify ourselves as a knowledgeable source for boating solutions. We can also provide operator certification and non -traditional seminars for busy families.

This is how District 10 can make America's Boating Club more approachable, appealing and user friendly to ourselves and the boating public in Minnesota and Wisconsin.
