
Commander's Message by Robert Rondou, AP



Advanced Course Strategy



Piloting, which when completed achieves an Advanced Piloting (AP) grade. Later this year, Advanced Marine Navigation will be offered as a successor to the Advanced Piloting course. Beyond the AP grade, there are two legacy courses—Junior Navigation (JN) and Navigation (N)—that offer a path to the Navigator grade. There are also two new courses—Offshore Navigation (ON) and Celestial Navigation (CN)—that offer new distinct path to the Navigator grade. Offshore Navigation and Celestial Navigation are now available in eBook format.

Later this year, we will also be introducing a new Inland Boater course, which will offer another path to the Senior Navigator grade. Future of the Junior Navigation and Navigation Courses: We have decided to retire the Junior Navigation and Navigation courses due to the evolving nature of boating education and the need to provide more comprehensive and up-to-date courses. Junior Navigation will be removed from the catalog on April 1, and Navigation will be removed on July 1 (at the start of the new educational year). Some instructors may feel more comfortable teaching these old courses, and that's all right. Act now, so your students can still finish the JN/N path. As of March 1, we had 40 JN and 59 N student manuals in stock. Buy the books before our stock is depleted and teach the courses sometime in the next 2 years. NOAA no longer provides the raster charts previously used in the JN/N courses. Errata sheets are available for each course to guide students in obtaining ENC charts. These are available on the Educational Department web page: click Navigation Committee, then either Junior Navigation or Navigation. We will support JN and N exams for 2 years from the date of course retirement. Sight folders can be submitted any time in the future with copies of the relevant pages from the Nautical Almanac. Stf/ C Doug Durfee, SN, will be the contact for these courses.

Grade Progression Policy
